For our September men's group, the men of New Life went to Harbor Springs Sportsman's Club and spent the evening shooting guns, sharing our firearms with one another, and teaching those who needed it how to safely handle their weapons. We weren't sure how the evening would go because we had never done anything like it before. Usually, we meet for dinner, fellowship, and then a nice time of teaching and discussion. This format has worked very well, and men's group has been a nice staple of New Life's ministry the last five or more years.

When we planned the night at the shooting range, we did so a few months in advance with the hope that men would come. We ended up with twelve guys showing up and we all had a wonderful time. The consensus was that we need to do this again. This really got me thinking about how much we have missed regular fellowship since COVID began, and probably even before that.

It isn't uncommon for us to meet for bible study, book study, men's group, women's group, and regular Sunday worship. We don't all make it to all things all the time, but we have a normal sequence that has provide ample opportunity for people to get connected to one another and to come learn and worship. What we haven't done for a long time is have different fellowship events. It has been several years since we have had a game night and even longer since we have had a movie night. Dan and I host a trip to Traverse City Pit Spitters game every year, but usually he and I are the only ones who attend. We were blessed with some others this past summer.

The point is that it is important for us to gather. It is important for us to be together. But we really need time together that is more than just worship and study. As the quote from Hebrews above suggests, we should not neglect meeting together, but our meeting isn't just about Sunday worship. If we are going to stir up one another to love and good works, and are going to encourage one another, then we need more relaxed opportunities to do that. Bible studies and men's and women's groups are certainly opportunities for that, but as we learned at the shooting range, there is a great benefit to just gathering and having fun together. If we only gather in formal worship and study sessions, we may learn how to live a Christian life, but we don't get the opportunity to actually live that life together.



Too many times I have walked with my eyes blinded by other concerns and failed to "take off my shoes" and "see."

There are beautiful hymns that speak to the wonder of God's creation. Several verses from the hymn "All Creatures of our God and King" have these words:" "Great rushing winds and breezes soft, you clouds that ride the heavens aloft....Fair rising morn, with praise rejoice, stars nightly shinning, find a voice.. Swift flowing water, pure and clear, make music for your Lord to hear... O praise him, O praise him, Al-le-lu-ia...!"

For this article I looked for that copy just to confirm the words to the second verse but I could not find it. So, I Googled the hymn but every site I found failed to include the second verse as I had memorized it. In desperation, I called Tracey.

It turns out that the version that I had memorized came from the music Ferd provided for a Sunday service. So, "Thank you Ferd!" And here are the words from the real version, Ferd's version, that I love - "When through woods and forest glades I wonder, and hear the birds sing sweetly in the trees; when I look down from lofty mountain grandeur, and hear the brook and feel the gentle breeze; then sings my soul, my Savior God to thee; How Great Thou Art..."

One of America's favorite songs opens with a verse that should be familiar to us all: "O beautiful for spacious skies, For amber waves of grain, For purple mountain majesties, Above the fruited plain! America! America! God shed His grace on thee, And crown thy good with brotherhood, From sea to shining sea!"

The Apostle Paul in his letter to the church in Rome reminds us why these are more than just nice words for ballads and hymns. He wrote that the awesomeness of the created order is so revealing of God's handiwork that no one will be able to stand before Him and say they failed to "see" that all of it was the work of His hands.




1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 we are told:




