ORDINARY TIME

We are now in the season of ordinary time, celebrated with the color green. It is the liturgical period that does not fall within the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter, and runs for up to 34 weeks. It is celebrated at two times each year. The first period runs from The Feast of The Baptism of Our Lord until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday and the second from The 2nd Sunday after Pentecost until the day prior to the 1st Sunday in Advent. It is a time of growth and renewal in each Christians spiritual life.


