We are now in the season of ordinary time, celebrated with the color green. It is the liturgical period that does not fall within the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, or Easter, and runs for up to 34 weeks. It is celebrated at two times each year. The first period runs from The Feast of The Baptism of Our Lord until the Tuesday evening before Ash Wednesday and the second from The 2nd Sunday after Pentecost until the day prior to the 1st Sunday in Advent. He made it known by sending his angel to his servant John, <sup>2</sup>who bore witness to the word of God and to the testimony of Jesus Christ, even to all that he saw. <sup>3</sup>Blessed is the one who reads aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear, and who keep what is written in it, for the time is near. <sup>4</sup>John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, <sup>5</sup>and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John.

People: **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

<sup>33</sup>So Pilate entered his headquarters again and called Jesus and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" <sup>34</sup>Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" <sup>35</sup>Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered

you over to me. What have you done?" <sup>36</sup> Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world." <sup>37</sup> Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice."

**People: Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

**Sermon** The Rev. Michael J. Bridge

**The Presentation** *page 162-163*

Celebrant: The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

**Godparents and Sponsoring Parents: I present Sarah Elizabeth Bridge to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.**

Celebrant: Today, on behalf of *this child*, you shall make vows to renounce the devil and all his works, to trust God wholeheartedly, and to serve him faithfully. It is your task to see that *this child* is taught, as soon as *she* is able to learn, the meaning of all these vows, and of the Faith that you will profess as revealed in the Holy Scriptures. *She* must come to put *her* faith in Jesus Christ, and learn the Creeds, the Lord's Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and all other things that a Christian ought to know, believe, and do for the welfare of *her soul*. When *she* has embraced all these, *she* is to come to the Bishop to be confirmed, that *she* may publicly claim the Faith for *her* own and be further strengthened by the Holy Spirit to serve Christ and his kingdom.

Celebrant: Are you willing and ready to undertake this?

**Godparents and Sponsoring Parents: I am, the Lord being my helper.**

**Profession of Faith** *page 164*

*The Celebrant then examines the Godparents and Sponsoring Parents who will speak on behalf of infants or young children, saying:*

Question: Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

**Answer: I renounce them.**

Question: Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

**Answer: I renounce them.**

Question: Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?

**Answer: I renounce them.**

*The Celebrant prays over the Candidates and may anoint each Candidate with the Oil of Exorcism, saying*

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil, and lead you into the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*The Celebrant continues*

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

**Answer: I do.**

Question: Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

**Answer: I do.**

Question: Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the days of your life?

**Answer: I will, the Lord being my helper.**

*The Celebrant then addresses the Congregation, first inviting them to stand.*

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *this person in her* life in Christ?

*The Congregation responds*

**We will.**

*The Celebrant then says*

Let us join with *this Candidate* to proclaim our faith in the words of the ancient baptismal confession, the Apostles' Creed.

Celebrant: Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

**People: I do. I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant: Do you believe and trust in Jesus Christ?

**People: I do. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant: Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

**People: I do. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**

## **Litany for the Candidates** *page 166*

*The Deacon, or other person appointed, may say*

Let us now pray for *this Candidate* who is to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

That *this child* may come to confess *her* faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

**We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

That *this Candidate* may continue in the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers.

**We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

That *she* may walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which *she has* been called, ever growing in faith and all heavenly virtues.

**We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

That *she* may persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever *she fall* into sin, repent and return to the Lord.

That *she* may proclaim by word and deed the Good News of God in Christ Jesus to a lost and broken world.

## **Prayer for the Candidates** *page 167*

*The Celebrant now prays for the Candidates as follows*

Celebrant: Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, prefiguring the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Look mercifully upon *this your servant*. Wash and sanctify *her* through your Holy Spirit, that *she* may be delivered from destruction and received into the Ark of

Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, she may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

## **Thanksgiving Over the Water** *page 167-168*

*The Deacon, or the Celebrant, pours the water for Baptism.*

**Celebrant:** The Lord be with you.

**People:** **And with your spirit.**

**Celebrant:** Lift up your hearts.

**People:** **We lift them up to the Lord.**

**Celebrant:** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People:** **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

*The Celebrant continues*

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John in the River Jordan when the Holy Spirit descended upon him as a dove.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are made regenerate by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*Here the Celebrant touches the water and says*

Now, Father, sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit. May all who are baptized here be cleansed from sin, be born again, and continue for ever faithful in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## **The Baptism** *page 169-170*

*Then the Celebrant pours water upon the Candidate three times, saying*

*Sarah Elizabeth Bridge, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.***

*The Celebrant makes the sign of the Cross upon the forehead of the newly baptized, saying*

*Sarah, receive the sign of the Cross as a token of your new life in Christ, in which you shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, to fight bravely under his banner against the world, the flesh, and the devil, and to continue as his faithful soldier and servant to the end of your days. **Amen.***

*Candles are presented, they are given here.*

*When all have been baptized and signed the Celebrant says*

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon *this* your servant the forgiveness of sin, received *her* as your own child by adoption, made *her* a member of your holy Church, and raised *her* to the new life of grace. Sustain *her*, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit, that *she* may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*The Celebrant continues*

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Celebrant and People*

**We receive you into the fellowship of the Church. Confess the faith of Christ**

### **Prayer of Consecration** *page 132-134*

**Celebrant:** Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become, subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son Jesus Christ into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.**

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts.

In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **Amen.**
