THE SEASON OF EPIPHANY

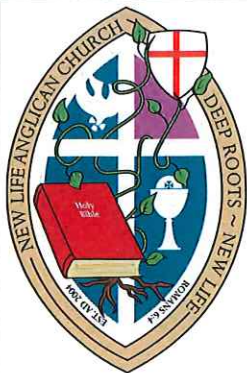
