We will glorify God by deepening the roots of our Anglican faith, and bringing people to new life in Jesus Christ.

If there is one thing we all know, it is that life doesn't always make sense. We often don't know why things are happening the way they are happening. As Christians, it is usually easy to trust that God knows what is going on and has a good purpose for it, but sometimes that feels very difficult to believe.

This really isn't about being a bold Christian or not. It is about how we face different things happening in our lives. Some of the boldest followers of God haven't been able to make sense of certain things happening in their lives. Elijah is a great example. Here is a guy who wasn't afraid to confront kings, taunted and then slaughtered the priests of baal, and performed incredible miracles, including raising someone from the dead.

Elijah also ran and hid for fear of his life. He hid in a cave and when God asked him what he was doing there, he told God that he had to hide because he was the only one of God's people left. He made it sound like he wasn't doing it for God, but he was doing it because he was afraid. At another point, he fell into great depression and told God that he would be better off dead.

It is strange to see the two sides of Elijah side by side. We would expect that God's chosen would never be afraid, especially those to whom God speaks directly, like Elijah. Given the crazy things he did, like confront, humiliate, then slaughter the priests of baal, it is surprising to see the side of him that is afraid or depressed. If the bible were a collection of mythical stories about heroes, we would almost certainly not see the weakness of God's chosen people. The bible is something else, though. It is a book of actual events that show us the truth about how hard it is to walk with God, even when we have a very close connection to him.

Elijah is far from the only one of God's people to have lapses of trust in God. Abraham, despite picking up and leaving everything behind at the whim of God's call, would lie about Sarah being his wife (even letting kings have her as a lover in the nighttime) because he was afraid that if he said she was his wife, they would kill him and take her from him. He did this multiple times. Jonah tried to avoid God's commands altogether by heading in the opposite direction of where God sent him.

Being a Christian, I know that God has everything in control. I have no fear or concerns about the big picture. I am quite satisfied in the goodness of God that I will spend eternity with him. I don't always know about the smaller picture stuff. Intellectually, I know that God is taking care of those things as well. But as I face different things in life, it can be easy to forget that God is working all things for the good of those who love him and are called according to his purposes.

Let me give an example that comes from over eighteen years ago. One of my highest desires in life was always to be a husband and father. In the late spring 2003, my brother and sister-in-law came over to my parents' house (where I still lived, I was in seminary at the time) to announce that they were pregnant with their first child. Everyone was super excited except me. I didn't mean to not be excited, and I later apologized to my brother about not seeming excited. It happened that I had been sitting in my room feeling sorry for myself that I hadn't even been on a date in over two years and then they came over with that news and it made me feel even more sorry for myself.

Why I believe in the God of the Bible

Some years ago I was listening to Greg Koukl from Stand to Reason on the radio. He told of a time when his daughter asked him why he believed in God. As his daughter was quite young, he knew his answer had to be concise and easily understood. So, after some thought he told her that he believed in God because as he looked at the world it made more sense to believe in God than to not believe. That is all I remember of what he explained but I wonder what might have followed.



As I think about this it seems hard for me to distinguish between believing in the existence of "god" and the existence of the "God" of the Bible. When I reflect on the world, I see its beauty, its ugliness, its good and its evil. Then as I read the Bible I see all of these aspects revealed. The Bible is a book of faith that portrays the world as it really is; but this is not the end of the story. In the end, there is completeness and redemption; triumph and victory. But maybe I'm getting ahead of myself.

The Bible opens with an explanation of how it all began. How everything initially came into existence with an amazingly concise statement: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." To me that opening statement in Genesis declares two fundamental truths: (I) Everything in the universe was created at one time or another; and (2) God is assumed to have always existed. He is not a created being and but exists of His very necessity because if at any time there was nothing at all; not even God, then nothing would exist today. It is a true statement that out of nothing comes nothing and that there must be a first cause for anything to exist.

Some have asked: "Who created God?" and if you respond that God must have created the god who created everything else, they will likely ask again: "Who created that God? This question and answer could keep repeating until you finally have come to the realization this could not continue into infinity. Ultimately, there must have been a First Cause for all that followed. As I said above, without a First Cause, nothing would exist today.

In the same first chapter of the Bible we are also told that God is the Author of life. On November 24, 1859 the book "The Origin of Species" by Charles Darwin was published in which he tried to account for the diversity of life through evolutionary means. While much of his theory of slow evolutionary changes is under dispute, the idea that evolution can account for the variety of life has not been abandoned by the secularists. Even so what has not been answered by the scientific

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community, however, is how life first began. In 1953 chemists Stanley Miller and Harold Urey conducted an experiment hoping to show how life did begin. Although initially hailed as a success, the experiment ultimately failed. While it did produce in some amino acids the experiment was later found to be based on incorrect assumptions about the earth's early atmosphere.

In 2004 Zondervan published a book by Lee Strobel entitled The Case For a Creator. In the book Lee Strobel relates his interviews with noted scientist of various fields: cosmology, physics, biochemistry, biology and other related disciplines. What becomes clear in these interviews is that this creation is of a magnitude of order and precision that defies explanation. In regard to our own home in this immense cosmos (planet earth) the number of exact conditions which exist and that make life possible is staggering.

Earlier in this article, I mentioned that the Bible reveals the truth about the world we live in; including that evil is part of it. This invites the question that if evil exists how could there be a good God who would allow this to exist? If he is powerless to stop it, then he must not exist or be a good god at all.

Actually, the reverse is more accurate. The fact that we recognize evil at all indicates that we also recognize a standard of goodness. If evil and goodness really do exist and apply to everyone then there must be a God. Why is that? Simply because if there is no God, no Creator and everything came into existence without intent, design, or purpose then everything, and I mean everything, is just natural. It is neither right or wrong; good or evil. It just is.

I do not believe this is the case. I make judgements all the time. Some of them may be correct and some may be mistaken but the fact that I do make judgements indicates that I believe in an ultimate standard of good and evil which I am attempting to apply to my own life. A standard not of my making but one established by the Ultimate Standard maker; God.

This is a difficult subject to address in a short article. There are libraries filled with books on this subject. So let me end in this way: In order to not believe in God, I would have to believe that everything came from nothing; that life came from non-life; that chaos was the author of order and precision; and that good and evil do not really exist. I can not hold to such an empty, hopeless faith as that.

Therefore, I believe in the Creator, the First Cause of everything; of order, of life and the ultimate standard of goodness and righteousness. I believe in the God of the Bible. ~ Wally's Gallery

There was no reason for me to not be happy for them. Why should I be sad about God's blessings in their lives just because I couldn't make sense of my own? And just because I was busy being depressed and having a one-person pity party didn't mean that God wasn't still working out his good plan in my life. It is important in those times to remember what we believe about God. It is also helpful to know what we believe about him during the good times so that we can fall back on that knowledge in the harder times.

My story could have ended there. I know people who want to be married and aren't. But that wasn't the purpose God had for me. Feeling sorry for myself didn't affect what God had in store. I learned of my sister-in-law's pregnancy in the spring, feeling hopeless in my own affairs. In the summer I met Bonnie. By October we were engaged. When my nephew was born in February, Bonnie was there for it.

We don't know what God is going to do in our lives tomorrow. We don't know why things are the way they are right now. Things can seem bleak, and it can even feel like God is against us. The truth is, he is still there and working. He has a purpose. He has a plan that he is working out. He doesn't give us all the details as he unfolds it, but he never stops being active in our lives.

Let's go back to Elijah. He hid in a cave because he thought he was the last of God's faithful and he didn't want to be killed. His biggest fear in the moment was that the enemy was too great, and it would cost him his life. He knew that God was with him during his confrontation with the priests of baal, so he had no fear at all. But in this moment, hiding in a cave, he wasn't so sure. What did God do with his fear of death? He eventually made it so that he never died. He took him up in a chariot of fire to be with him in heaven. While that may be unlikely to happen to us, the underlying message of God's faithfulness to us even when we don't understand what is happening stands.

Life won't always make sense. Circumstances are often dramatically different than we would like them to be. But God is always there. He is always at work. He never abandons us. God can handle your questions about why things are happening the way they are. And he will hold you closely as a loving Father and comfort you while continuing to work out his plan in his time.
