Truth isn't something that comes naturally to us. We might like to think it does, but from the earliest days of a child they will lie to get out of

trouble. I will never forget one such exchange with one of my sons. I will leave them nameless to protect the guilty. He said to me, "Dad, someone pooped my pants." I asked who he thought did it. His response, "I don't know, maybe [my brother]?"

Yes, its funny. It was also an earnest exchange. That struggle with truth begins in us all at an early age and continues for the rest of our lives. We may bend the truth because we are embarrassed, as my son obviously was. We may do so because we don't want to hurt someone's feelings, we don't want to get in trouble, or lying is just easier. There are all sorts of reasons that we begin toying with the truth. The real question is why do we continue this way as we get older?

I know that there is no simple solution other than sin. We are fallen and therefore acting in righteousness is always a struggle. But that is more of a big picture answer. Why do I struggle with truth as an individual? Why do you? Why do individuals struggle with it? The answer may vary for each of us, but one answer is power. Lying gives us a power that truth often doesn't. Or, at least it seems that way. It feels more powerful to tell people that our church has about one hundred members instead of the seventyish that we really have. Making the church seem bigger makes my own success seem bigger. When my success seems bigger, I seem bigger.

In truth, no one cares. When someone asks how big our church is, they are drawing a line between mega-church and tiny little church that the mega-church will eventually put out of business. They aren't concerned with me adding an additional thirty people. Then who am I making myself bigger to? I guess me. I guess I am trying to impress myself. Apparently, I am easily impressed.

Maybe for you the untruths are different. Maybe they appear on your taxes. Maybe they are reflected in which websites you go to versus what people think you look at. Maybe they are in how much money you spend on things you aren't supposed to or that you are embarrassed of. Regardless, if there was no benefit to lying, we probably wouldn't do it. Though sometimes we sin just for the sake of sinning. Augustine of Hippo once lamented a time when he stole pears from a man's orchard. He felt an extra guilt about it after becoming a Christian because there was no benefit to it. He said he didn't even like pears. The sin was just for the purpose of the sin.

WALLY'S GALLERY -

On the fourth Thursday of this month most of this country will set aside the day, from all other Thursdays of the year, to enjoy family and hopefully remember to take time to reflect on the unique blessings this country has enjoyed.

Recently, however, the idea that there is something unique to our form of governance has been disputed; that we really are no different than



other countries. I believe, however, that history reveals a different truth; we have been blessed because the founders of this nation embedded three unique features into our Constitution:

The Rule of Law - in which the laws established are applied to everyone, not by the arbitrary decision of one or a select group of leaders.

Federalism - that both the Federal government and State governments remain sovereign with rights balanced between the two. Federalism is defined in the Tenth Amendment of the Constitution and states that: "The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people."

The Separation of Powers - that our liberties are protected by dividing the powers of government into three equal bodies: the Executive, the Judicial, and the Legislative.

The wisdom of our founders that brought about our blessings in these ideas was not by happenstance; but rather evolved from the experiences and intentions of those who first landed on our shores some 200 years before.

Both the Jamestown Colony in Virginia (1607) and the Plymouth Plantation in Massachusetts (1620) established charters that emphasized a Christian purpose in their expedition. From the First Charter of Virginia, "We, greatly commending, and graciously accepting, their desires for the furtherance of so noble a work, which may, by the providence of Almighty God, hereafter tend to the glory of HIS Divine Majesty, in propagating of the Christian religion to such people as yet live in darkness..." And these words from the preamble of the Mayflower Compact signed by the Pilgrims; "Having undertaken for the Glory of God and the advancement of the Christian faith..." to which William Bradford, Governor of the Plymouth Colony wrote that they should be but "stepping stones" in the propagation of the Christian faith. Most of our struggles with truth are probably deeper than the desire to steal pears just for the sake of it. Usually I do think it is because we perceive that we gain something: a nod of validation from a peer, a sense of superiority, a relief from consequences, or the ability to maintain our hidden selves which we don't want people to see. Lies have power.

Lies have power. There is a reason why our media trades in lies. They are powerful. They help accomplish one's goals. And when there is no presumed authority over you- like in the case of the media- then there is no one to fact-check the lies and point people to the truth. We know that the wider world has a very tenuous relationship with truth, and even with being interested in what is true. There is power to be had and that power is far more interesting and intriguing than something as quaint as truth. One day God will ask each person if it was worth it. "What good did your lies do you? Was it worth gaining political control, power, wealth, influence in the world even though it has cost your soul?"

We must be above that. I don't want to hear that question asked of me. I know that you don't either. Thus, we must commit ourselves to truth. The first step in doing this is to repent of our untruths and hand them to God. Don't be embarrassed, he already knows all about them. Then we turn away from our natural inclination to lies and ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with all truth. We must dig into his word and ask him to replace our opinions with his truth as he has revealed it. And then we commit ourselves to living with integrity, telling the truth, living the truth, reflecting the truth, even when it is hard or costly. In this way we guard our souls, even if it costs us the world.


