- 11 I know all the birds of the air, and the wild beasts of the field are in my sight.
- 12 If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the whole world is mine, and all that is therein.
- 13 Do you think that I will eat the flesh of bull and drink the blood of goats?
- 14 Offer unto God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and pay your vows unto the Most High,
- 15 And call upon me in the time of trouble; so will I hear you, and you shall praise me."
- 16 But to the ungodly God says: "Why do you recite my laws, and take my covenant in your mouth, 17 Though you hate to be disciplined, and have cast my words behind you?
- 18 When you saw a thief, you agreed with him, and you have taken part with adulterers.


