We will glorify God by deepening the roots of our Anglican faith, and bringing people to new life in Jesus Christ.

For the past two months many of us at New Life have been working through the study "Confessing the Faith: Anglican Doctrine." It has been a wonderful study so far and has been well-attended. I am thankful for those who have come out and been a part of the study. For those who haven't attended, I wanted to give a brief run-down of what we have been learning.

We just wrapped up the first half of the study, which is Part 1: God and Humanity. The wonderful thing about this course is that everything is very well researched and well-attested by scripture. Chapter 1 is An Introduction to the Study of the Christian faith. It served as an overview of all that we are going to look at in the course. It had an extensive survey to see where people are in their knowledge and study of God. Everything covered in that survey is taught throughout the rest of the course.

Next is Chapter 2, Our Knowledge of God. This dealt with how we know anything about God. There is general and special revelation. General revelation comes in the form of seeing that God exists from creation alone. We can't know specifics about God from creation, but his existence is clear. Special revelation is the sixty-six books of the bible which are God-breathed and inspired so that we can know the specifics about God, his plan, our problem (sin), and how he restores us in Christ.

Chapter 3 is the Doctrine of God. This looked at the Christian view of God compared to other worldviews such as atheism, agnosticism, deism, pantheism, polytheism, and materialism. What we learn about God is that he is a self-existent, eternal being who exists as a Trinity. There are three persons in the godhead, but there is only one God. The Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God. The Father is not the Son or the Holy Spirit. The Son is not the Father or the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is not the Father or the Son. All are God. There is only one God. But there are three persons. We also learned about the various attributes of God such as transcendence, immanence, omniscience, omnipotence, and others.

Chapter 4 is the Person of Christ. This looked at how we understand Jesus as taught in the bible, and various heresies that distorted that understanding. Jesus is fully God and fully human. The two parts don't mingle and aren't diminished at all because of this union. Jesus came into the world through the Holy Spirit and Mary. In the early church, the most common mistake or heresy that was faced dealt with the nature of Jesus. Some said that he was just a man but not God. Some said he was God but not man. Some said he appeared as man, but was really only God. Some said he was a special creation greater than man, but lesser than God. The scripture teachers us that Jesus is the eternal Son of God who has always existed as the second member of the godhead, and through whom everything was created.

Chapter 5 is the Person and Work of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is often called the forgotten God because we don't talk much about him. This makes sense because one of his primary

I thought it most deserving for this holy season of the year. "Dr. James Allen Francis (1864–1928) served as Pastor of First Baptist Church of Los Angeles from 1914 to 1928. He wrote a book entitled The Real Jesus and Other Sermons, published by Judson Press in 1926. He included a sermon in this book that he had preached to The National Baptist Young Peoples' Union on July 11, 1926. In that sermon, Dr. Francis summarized the impact of Jesus' life with a story that has since become known by the title One Solitary Life. Dr. Francis' summary of lesus' life has been shared countless times through the years. I hope that you'll take a moment to read it, reflect on its message, and share it with others this Christmas. This is a simple way to turn our thoughts back to lesus during this busy season filled with so many things that distract us from Him. Here is a man who was born in an obscure village, the child of peasant woman. He grew up in still

was an itinerant preacher.

He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family or owned a home. He never went to college. He never put his foot inside a big city. He never traveled two hundred miles from the place where he was born. He never did one of the things that usually accompany greatness. He had no credentials but himself.

another village where He worked in a carpenter shop until He was thirty. Then for three years He

While He was still a young man the tide of popular opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. One of them denied him. He was turned over to his enemies. He went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. His executioners gambled for the only property He had while on earth, and that was his coat. When He was dead, He was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend.

Nineteen wide centuries have come and gone, and today He is the central figure of the human race and the leader of the column of progress. I am far within the mark when I say that all the armies that ever marched, and all the navies that were ever built, and all the parliaments that ever sat, and all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man upon this earth as powerfully as has this one solitary life."

functions is to bear witness to Jesus, not to himself. The bible teaches that the Holy Spirit is a person, it uses the pronoun "him" for the Spirit, and it tells us that he is God. So, the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, eternal and present at creation as he hovered over the waters. Some of the functions of the Holy Spirit include he glorifies Christ, inspires scripture, interprets scripture, gifts Christians for ministry, causes new birth, sanctifies us, and intercedes for us, to name a few.

Chapter 6 is about Humanity. It deals with our creation, that God created us to rule over all creation, to be in community with one another, to be fruitful and multiply, and to know and love God. Unfortunately, Adam sinned in the Garden of Eden causing the fall of mankind. Because of that, we are all born with original sin, which is the stain from Adam that taints us all and causes us to sin. We then commit actual sins because of the taint of original sin. We are alienated from God, from one another, from ourselves, and from creation thanks to sin. But God doesn't let sin have the last say. He rescues us through the saving work of his Son Jesus Christ.

Part 2: Salvation is what we will be looking at next. It covers the work of Christ, becoming a Christian, growing as a Christian, being involved in a church, the sacraments, and the end times. If you haven't joined us on this journey, you are still able to join for Part 2. Even if you aren't going to do that, I hope that this summary of what we have studied so far has been intriguing and helpful to see what we are working on at New Life.


